Chair Campbell called the meeting to order and determined a quorum.

Minutes

Chair Campbell called for approval of the minutes of the September 21, 2015 Cable Television Commission. **Mr. Lindsey made a motion to approve, seconded by Mr. Heinrich. The motion passed.**

Consider a request from City Schools Director to cover the Read to Bee Spelling Bee April 9, 2016. Mr. Bozeman stated there is a request for CityTV to cover this outside program. Staff has covered this event for a number of years. This event will take place at Patterson Park Community Center. Read to Succeed has met all criteria required to cover this event and all information was provided for review in the agenda package. Representatives from Read to Succeed were present. The Read to Succeed representative stated that the bee invites student in the 6th grade for all city, county, and private schools in Rutherford County with an average of about 20 participants. Mr. Heinrich asked where the winners advance to. The representative stated that there are prizes given and it helps in preparation for the national spelling bee. Mr. Bozeman said this program would be recorded and replayed at a later date and also viewable online via the city's website. **Mr. Shacklett made a motion to approve seconded by Mr. Lindsey. The motion passed.**

Consider a request from City Schools Director to cover the Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Awards Banquet April 8, 2016. Mr. Bozeman stated there is a request for CityTV to cover the scholarship awards banquet. This year it will take place at MTSU in the James Union Building on April 10th. High School students in Rutherford County are the recipients. MLK Board has met all criteria required to cover this event and all information was provided for review in the agenda package. An email was received Friday from Mr. Michael James who is the MLK Chair Person and a Board of Directors Member to ask how much space was needed. There seemed to be a concern about limited space available for our camera equipment due to the room set up. Any approval should be subject to available space for the video camera and staff person.

Mr. Patterson made a motion to approve seconded by Mr. Heinrich. Mr. Lindsey asked if both activities being one day apart would be a problem for the department. Mr. Bozeman said there should not be a problem. Mr. Patterson asked if this type outside production could have sponsorships. Mr. Bozeman said that it could be and the CityTV program policy addressed underwriting and sponsorships if approached but there is not a staff member that goes out and solicits such sponsors. **The motion passed.**

Front Range Consulting Report on Comcast Franchise Fee Review

Mr. Bozeman stated Front Range Consulting has been working on the Comcast Franchise Fee Review. The period of review was for January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2014. The agenda package includes the report on the findings. Mr. Dick Treich joined the meeting via conference calls to go over the report.

Mr. Treich reported that he had sent a data request to Comcast so he could conduct the review. Comcast responded to most questions in the timeframe of about a month. The missing information was the billing reports that show how the video portion is allocated for bundled packages. With double and triple play packages the collected franchise fee is separated out of the bundle price since franchise fees are not collected on internet and phone service. Comcast took much longer than his previous experience to gather this data because they are using a very old billing program that was used by the previous cable owners before Comcast bought the Murfreesboro franchise. They were not able to provide a normal report that he is use to seeing in other communities across the country. Comcast had to build a report and create something from the billing records and data. Looking at the data, it does not make logical since. Table 1 on page 5 the numbers of subscribers are redacted, it is unusual for the bundled packages to run between 0% and 8% of customers. Comcast customers in double or triple play packages is normally around 30% to 70%. In the case of Murfreesboro the data provided by Comcast for Murfreesboro shows between 0% and 8% are in double and triple play packages for 2012 - 2014. Comcast was asked to provide certifications from a financial officer saying that the data given was correct and reflected the records of Comcast. Comcast refused to provide the certification and it is not unusual that they would refuse to do this. Most times the data can pass the logical test that it looks correct, but in the case of data from Comcast is not logical.

No assurance can be given that the numbers are correct until Comcast can respond with logical data or a certification of what was provided. Comcast reviewed the report prior to staff providing it to the Cable TV Commission. At this point Comcast knew the concerns and the numbers made no logical sense. There was an email received from Comcast that said to redact the subscriber numbers from Table 1 and they were checking on the problem with the bundled subscriber numbers and the number of packages originally provided. This email was sent the middle of January 2016. The information has been in their possession for at least 4 weeks with no response and they know that the review is incomplete due to the inconsistent data. There was another minor concern with the equipment pieces of the package, but that was a very minor issue.

Mr. Campbell questioned if the main issue is that the official number of subscribers is unknown. Mr. Treich said he knows the number of subscribers that Comcast has. Mr. Campbell then inquired that based on the number of subscribers, it is unknown how many subscribe to bundle packages. Mr. Treich said Comcast has given him a subscriber bundle number between 0% and 8% for Murfreesboro. Based on the national average that number should be at around 30% to 70% in bundled packages. From what Comcast has provided the data looks inaccurate and illogical. Mr. Treich said in realistic terms the number is around 25,000 subscribers in the system and about 2,000 in 2015 were subscribers to a double and triple play that would be 8%. The double play package is more common that contains video, high speed data, or voice product, but the triple play had a higher percentage which includes all three. Comcast reported in 2013 and 2014 zero subscribers on the double play package, which makes no sense.

Mr. Patterson stated besides the numbers not adding up, there was no certification. Mr. Treich said that is correct and this is the way Comcast responds to other communities, but a certification is always requested. The responses to data requests does not come back to Mr. Treich on letterhead from Comcast. Mr. King asked if the commission has a recourse. Mr. Treich said he recommends to send some type of formal letter to Comcast for a response of the concerns raised about the data. If Comcast does not respond, then exploring whether there is a breach of the franchise agreement is in order. The definition of gross revenue in the franchise is written very good related to how to address bundled packages. Comcast local billing system being used is not allowing the data to be pulled from the system or Comcast is using the system incorrectly. In other communities where data has been received, there have been mistakes found.

Mr. Shacklett asked how it is determined that the data is not accurate. Mr. Treich said comparing the trending Comcast report released to investors on their website shows the number of customers nationwide in double and triple play packages for Comcast is about 70%. Mr. Bozeman stated that the report Mr. Treich provided based on the data Comcast provided him shows 0% for 2013 and 2014 in Murfreesboro. Mr. Treich said he started conducting a Comcast franchise fee review with Smyrna before Murfreesboro. They have the same issue with the billing report and their numbers are a bit higher than Murfreesboro, but are in low digits and low teens. It is a problem with the data being pulled from the billing system because it took 3 months for Smyrna to get their billing report created.

Mr. Patterson asked if there is a time limited that should be included in the letter to Comcast. Mr. Bozeman said if the commission is in agreement, staff could send a letter to Comcast providing the report and requesting Comcast respond to the report within 14 days. Mr. Patterson asked if the comparable nationwide data should be included. Mr. Treich said it could be included to make it clearer. With Comcast reporting in 2014 no customers on the double play packages it already seems like they provided illogical data for Murfreesboro. Mr. Lindsey stated that he was a double play customer in 2014. Mr. Shacklett asked when the commission would be satisfied with the report. Mr. Patterson said once Mr. Treich is comfortable with the report, it would ease his comfort level. Mr. King stated it seems like the incorrect data provided might have been an issue with retrieving it from their system. Mr. Treich said when

working with Smyrna, he asked Comcast for data, and their answer was it would take some time as the program was using AMDocs through a 3rd party billing company. Comcast has never pulled this particular data on the bundle packages from this program and they are having trouble getting data. Smyrna reported customers receiving new account numbers, and that would indicate that Comcast may be changing billing system. Comcast in Tennessee might be in the process of changing to the CSG program used in other communities across the country. Comcast may not be spending the time nor effort in pulling the correct data. Mr. King said the representative from Comcast stated at the last meeting he attended that they would be billing differently. Mr. Treich said Comcast across the country are on a daily billing cycle. If a customer calls today to hook up service then a bill would arrive in 30 days.

Mr. Campbell said his concern is the casual nature that they have chosen to respond to the data request. If Comcast is working on a plan to retrieve the data, the reply should have included that information and ask for an extension. A letter from the city is needed with a deadline for the information to be turned in. Based on the response from Comcast, we would then decide what our next step would be.

Mr. Lindsey said the data seems to be from just one day. Mr. Treich said that is possible. Mr. Treich stated he does not think that Comcast was attempting to hide data, they have accounting level persons that are not familiar enough with the billing system. The 3rd party billing program is not owned by Comcast, it is a matter of finding someone within the 3rd party billing company who knows the billing system inside and out and being able to retrieve the correct data.

Mr. Campbell asked what Comcast office the request for data was sent. Mr. Treich said it was sent to the local government affairs representative and the regulatory accounting group in Philadelphia.

Mr. Lindsey made a motion for staff to send a request for response letter to Comcast accompanied with the report from Front Range Consulting and Trending Reports with a 14 day deadline from the date of the letter, seconded by Mr. Patterson. Mr. Campbell asked if staff would follow up in a few days after the letter is sent to Russell Byrd. Mr. Bozeman said he would do that. **The motion passed.**

Staff Reports/Comments

Mr. Bozeman said there were 11 cable complaints received and there are a few that are not resolved. The customer present regarding one of the unresolved complaint said he has not received a response on his issue. Mr. Bozeman said he would give Comcast another call. Mr. King said several complaints are well written with details and dates about different issues. Mr. Patterson said he has spoken with one customer whose case has been open since October but still in dispute over \$150 worth of billing. Mr. Campbell said that the last conversation between the commission and Mr. Byrd of Comcast was that customer service would be their new mission and asked Mr. Bozeman if a call to Mr. Byrd would help express the concerns of the commission regarding the amount of time it takes to resolve issues. Mr. Bozeman said he would be happy to contact Mr. Byrd again. He has had numerous conversations regarding

those issues over some time. Mr. Byrd's response is that they are working on it. Mr. Patterson stated to their credit the new store is a better customer experience, however the same issues are brought up each commission meeting. A company as large as Comcast having issues with billing in their type of industry is surprising. Mr. Bozeman said Comcast use to respond and resolve issues brought to the attention of the City the same day but now it is taking days and weeks or longer.

Mr. Patterson asked when the decision by the FCC for the over the top services would be made. Mr. Bozeman said that issue is still pending with the FCC. Usually those types of rulings takes several years.

Department Benchmark Measures 1st and 2nd Quarter FY16

Mr. Bozeman went over the department benchmark measures for the most recent quarters and stated all the goals have been met.

Renovations and High Definition Television System Update

Mr. Bozeman stated that the Invitation to Bid is out for the equipment and installation for the new high definition television video production system and the bids will be opened next week. Lyle Lynch has been hired to help redesign the Communications Department workspace area and he will also oversee the work being done on the Council Chambers renovations. The tentative date is June 20th for the renovation work to begin. During this time the Council Chambers will be closed down for approximately three weeks. Meetings will be moved to Room 218 on the 2nd floor. Mr. Lindsey asked if there will be recordings of the meetings during the renovations. Mr. Bozeman said that there will be audio recordings only in Room 218.

There being no further business, Chair Campbell declared the meeting adjourned.

On April 11, 2016 at 12:00 noon in the Council Chambers of Murfreesboro City Hall the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission will make its evaluation of MTSU's use of both educational access channels located on Comcast cable channel 9 and 10 within Murfreesboro following a public hearing. The license of the second MTSU educational channel is subject to termination upon ninety (90) days notice following the public hearing.

An MTSU representative is encouraged to provide a report (please include a programming schedule) and presentation regarding Cable Channel 9 as it relates to the criteria the Commission will be looking at to evaluate the channel. If you would like to include a report for the Commission to review prior to the meeting to help the Commissioner's better prepare, please provide me with the report via .pdf to abozeman@murfreesborotn.gov no later than April 1, 2016.

During your presentation to the Commission, staff requests that you include or be prepared to address several questions related to programming on Channel 9:

- How many hours of new locally produced/non repeat educational programming on channel 9 were provided to Murfreesboro cable subscribers during 2015? What were some of these programs?
- When locally produced educational programming isn't being cablecast, what are some of the other types of programming sources available to Murfreesboro cable subscribers on Channel 9? What new, if any, satellite/non-locally produced programming are being planned for during 2016?
- How many months out of the year is channel 9 programming locally produced educational content?
- What new locally produced programs or initiatives took place with channel 9 during 2015 and are being planned for 2016 for the Murfreesboro cable subscribers benefit?
- From a technical standpoint, how is the channel monitored and what procedures are in place to respond to technical issues, such as the channel being off the air and in black or frozen for extended periods of time?

Criteria 1 – Public Good

The channels will serve the citizens of Murfreesboro and the university community with educational, informational, and entertainment programming.

Programming sources may vary by availability and contractual considerations. The goal of the channels is to increase the programming choices available to the cable subscriber. The channels will include programming with wide appeal as well as programming for more narrowly defined college student audiences which may include, but are not limited to: telecourse programs, foreign language newscasts, university produced programs, and college student produced programs.

Program sources, choices, and scheduling are decisions made within the respective department and division of the university, reflecting the policies and procedures as well as the pedagogical philosophies of those units.

Criteria 2 – Signal Quality

The channels will maintain a signal quality comparable to other access channels on the Murfreesboro cable system.

Internal factor: The University invests in physical facilities to equip the channels origination points consistent with the Board of Regents policy.

External Factor: Through program suppliers, satellite delivery systems, connections with the cable system head-end, and other avenues, the channels will strive for the highest signal quality possible.

Criteria 3 – Other Relevant Factors

The channels will adhere to the mission statements of the University, the Center for Educational Media, and the College of Mass Communication with the Department of Electronic Media Communication as a subunit of the College.

WHEREAS, the franchise agreement with Robin Media Group Inc., dba Intermedia provides for two (2) PEG channels for MTSU, subject to rules and regulations approved by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission considers a PEG channel to be a valuable asset of the community that should be utilized for the public good and therefore is willing to only grant a second PEG channel to MTSU conditionally as set forth below herein.


ORDER

This matter came on for consideration on the 9th day of November 1998 before the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission upon the request of MTSU for a second PEG channel. Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was

RESOLVED to grant MTSU a second PEG channel effective January 1, 1999, subject to evaluation of MTSU's use of both PEG channels for the public good, consideration of signal quality, and other relevant factors relating thereto. The CATV Commission will make its evaluation of MTSU's use of both channels in May 1999

following a public hearing and annually thereafter. The license of the second PEG channel is subject to termination upon ninety (90) days notice following any annual review following a public hearing. This Order 98-03 is subject to the approval of the Murfreesboro City Council; further review by the Cable Television Commission at its December 1998 meeting; and to acceptance of its terms by Middle Tennessee State University.



As noted above, the Education Resource Channel @ Middle Tennessee strives to produce unique programming that enhances K-12 education, teacher professional development, and lifelong community learning in middle Tennessee; to create and produce high quality video programs of educational merit; and to record outstanding academic events that enhance the University's mission to educate a diverse student body. By meeting these goals, ERC@MT continues to increase the programming choices available to Rutherford County cable subscribers. Programming includes topics of interest to specific viewers (K-12 teachers and students, MTSU faculty and students, etc.) as well as programs with broad appeal to the Rutherford County community (music concerts, Middle Tennessee history, Tennessee outdoors and wildlife, informative programs about national and world events, etc.)

Criterion 2 – Signal Quality

*The channels will maintain a signal quality comparable to other access channels on the Murfreesboro cable system.

The Education Resource Channel @ Middle Tennessee strives to maintain the highest signal quality possible for cable subscribers. New HD Digital satellite receivers will soon provide access and improved signal quality to the Classic Arts Showcase and NASA TV which provide programming for the station from midnight until 6:00am. The new Satellite equipment should be in place by summer 2016.

Signal Quality continued;

We continue to serve the Murfreesboro and Rutherford County communities, in addition to Cannon and DeKalb Counties and parts of Rutherford, Wilson, and Smith Counties through a partnership with DTC Television. A partnership with United Communications allows us to offer programming in Chapel Hill Tennessee and other surrounding communities. We added AT&T U-verse customers in Middle Tennessee to our viewership through a partnership between MTSU and AT&T.

Maintaining and/or improving our signal quality is a high priority for ERC@MT. In an effort to provide a consistent, high quality presence, we will upgrade our head end to HD by July 1, 2016, to accommodate the quality of our newer programs and meet the demands of customers that we service. This upgrade was scheduled for 2015 but due to continued construction constraints, it was delayed. All our equipment is now available to make this upgrade. We regularly review our equipment infrastructure to ensure that we have installed all current updates. Our recently installed fiber transceivers between MTSU's campus and Comcast's head end are working at optimal efficiency with the latest technology which provides a clearer, more stable feed. Our fiber equipment is HD Ready. When Comcast moves us into one of the HD channels, our HD equipment will deliver the highest quality that PEG broadcasting can offer.

*The channels will adhere to the mission statements of the University, the Center for Educational Media, and the College of Mass Communication with the Department of Electronic Media Communication as a subunit of the College.

The Education Resource Channel @ Middle Tennessee (ERC@MT) adheres to the mission statements of both Middle Tennessee State University and the Center for Educational Media in the following ways:

- On a daily basis, ERC@MT expands the reach of the university at the local and regional levels, and we have developed the capacity to expand university outreach both nationally and globally through our satellite and streaming initiatives.
- ERC@MT supports MTSU's efforts to generate, preserve and disseminate knowledge and innovation through media production and broadcast of high quality educational and community programming, including K-12 professional development and enriching programs for lifelong learners.
- ERC@MT is broadening our capacity to serve the diverse student population at MTSU by enhancing their access to information through closed captioning and audio description services. CEM is an active participant in the university's efforts to expand information accessibility to disabled populations. CEM will become the provider of closed captioning and audio description services to the university community when the Access Initiative is fully implemented beginning in 2017.

- ERC@MT develops and sustains academic partnerships supporting the creative activity of faculty at MTSU through programming such as “Portraits: The First Black American Divas of Song and Opera” (Art, Music, Dance, Theatre at MTSU, musical performance, history) and the MTSU Honors College Lecture Series (Honors College, guest speakers, current topics of interest)
- ERC@MT partners with faculty to support community outreach through programming produced in collaboration with the MTSU American Democracy Project including “Constitution Day at MTSU” and “Religious Pluralism: Bridging Cultures at Community Colleges Workshop” (National Endowment for the Humanities grant)

How many hours of new locally produced/non-repeat educational programming on channel 9 were provided to Murfreesboro cable subscribers during 2015? What were some of these programs?

CEM produced and broadcast **129** television programs in 2015, totaling **95+** hours.

While some programs were designed for K-12 teachers and classrooms, others were recordings of guest presentations and events at MTSU that we were able to bring to the Murfreesboro and Rutherford County communities. All programs had broad appeal and educational potential for multiple categories of viewers. These programs were produced and distributed in collaboration with public and private partners, including MTSU faculty and staff. Our partners include the American Democracy Project; the Center for Accelerated Language Acquisition (CALA); the Middle Tennessee Writing Project; Nashville Zoo at Grassmere, Art, Theatre, Dance and Music at Middle Tennessee; MTSU Honors College; the Heritage Center; Murfreesboro City Schools; Rutherford County Schools; the Tennessee Center for the Study and Treatment of Dyslexia; Tennessee Holocaust Commission; The College of Liberal Arts; F.I.R.E. Institute; MTSU News and Media Relations; MTSU Division of Marketing and Communications; The College of Basic and Applied Sciences; Women in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (WISTEM) Center and Michael "SUPE" Granda. We distribute MTSU Out of the Blue to NewsChannel 5+ in Nashville and our broadcast partners. Through PEGMedia, we offer MTSU Out of the Blue and several of our other productions including, Tennessee Century Farms, The Iron Furnace Trail, Naturally in Tennessee, The Greatest Songs You May Never Hear and Songspeak to PEG stations around the country. To date, we have on record **269** downloads by **34** stations from **14** states (CA, GA, IL, IN, LA, MA, ME, MI, NC, NE, PA, TN, TX, and WI) of MTSU Out of the Blue through PEGMedia. Also through PEGMedia, our other 50 productions have been downloaded **1662** times by **190+** stations in **37** states (AL, AR, AZ, CA, CO, CT, FL, GA, ID, IA, IL, IN, KS, LA, MA, MD, ME, MI, MN, MO, NC, NE, NH, NJ, NV, NY, OH, OK, OR, PA, SC, TN, TX, VA, VT, WI, WV). Through TelVue® Connect™ Media Exchange we share locally produced programs in HD to stations nationwide.

What new, if any, satellite / non-locally produced programming are being planned for during 2016?

We continue to work with the commercial educational video distributors from whom we licensed programming in 2015. Our live broadcasts of Colonial Williamsburg's H.E.R.O.s Live continue each month with four re-airings of each program. We anticipate that the number of programs we will be able to license in 2016 will be significantly fewer due to budget restrictions. Distributors include: Ambrose Video, Annenberg/Learner, Chip Taylor Communications, Films Ideas, Green Planet Films, Scott Petersen, TDC Entertainment, The Video Project, and Weston Woods.

How many months out of the year is Channel 9 programming locally produced educational content?

Locally produced educational programming for K-12 students and faculty, as well as other programming for Channel 9, are being produced year round.

What new locally produced programs or initiatives took place with channel 9 during 2015 and are being planned for 2016 for the Murfreesboro cable subscribers' benefit?

Various initiatives that will be continued in 2016 by CEM include Tennessee Board of Regents-Web Accessibility Training, the Tennessee Department of Education-Dyslexia Teacher training and a partnership with The Jason Foundation, a teen suicide prevention and information non-profit organization. We also collaborate with Middle Tennessee State University's Division of Marketing and Communications to co-produce a monthly show called "Out of the Blue," which highlights University events that may be of interest to the broader community. In addition, we work with Colleges and departments at MTSU to produce programming which brings campus events and guest speakers to the ERC viewing audience.

For the second year in a row, we have increased our staffing in ERC. This continued initiative allows us to better serve the Murfreesboro cable subscribers by providing programming information to Comcast for inclusion on their electronic programming guide. We await action on the part of Comcast to make this more complete program guide available to the viewing audience.

A third initiative that helps us better serve the Murfreesboro cable subscribers is the completion of the CEM Professional Development Center in 2015. This has afforded ERC the opportunity to expand our locally produced educational programming.

From a technical standpoint, how is the channel monitored and what procedures are in place to respond to technical issues, such as the channel being off the air and in black or frozen for extended periods of time?

The station is continuously monitored during business hours by five monitors located in five offices of key personnel and on a large monitor in the public lobby area. In addition the Engineering Unit's core room houses the monitoring station for the Comcast return and is checked periodically during the day, and if any problem is suspected or reported. The fiber optic send to Comcast is monitored periodically during the day. Any alarm or report of a loss of, or low quality, signal is reported to the ERC Production manager, Video/TV and the Assistant Engineer. They then notify the Chief Engineer and work with Comcast services to rectify the issue. During evening hours the ERC Production Manager Video/TV spot checks the station via a home Xfinity subscription or internet. In the event of a technical issue a remote desktop link is established to the video server and corrections made. The server itself is configured to broadcast the "Total Info" service when detecting a lost or corrupted video file. In the event of a power outage the Learning Resources Center building is equipped with emergency generators and the ERC video center in the LRC is equipped with battery backup utilities.

Dear Daniel,

My director Laura Clark suggested I email you our schedule for the Education Resource Channel @ Middle Tennessee for February. With Black History Month underway I have some great shows airing celebrating this time of remembrance. In addition to the schedule I am including an email I sent to Gina Fann in MTSU News and Media Relations describing the shows.

Since I wrote Ms. Fann three more shows have reached completion covering The Civil Rights Movement, two workshops for teachers and a lecture by a prominent professor.

" Hi Gina,
I wanted to apprise you of programming I have celebrating Black History Month scheduled to air on the Channel during February.

"Portraits: The First Black American Divas of Song and Opera".

Of course, very proud of this joint project between the channel and Professor Dina Cancryn, focusing on high school classrooms! Thank you for all the great promotion you have given this.

It will air the 3rd, 12th, 15th and 24th at 8:30 pm.

“1968: MTSU and the Dixie Controversy”.

By the station’s own Jordan Kirkman, this 15 minute documentary focuses on MTSU in 1968 and MTSU student and Sidelines writer Sylvester Brooks’ efforts to change the culture of the campus. Using the “Kerner Report” as a jumping off point, Brooks’ series of articles in Sidelines challenged the campus community to think about how the use of the song Dixie, the Confederate flag, and Gen. Nathan Bedford Forrest as the school’s mascot, reflected out dated values and alienated parts of the student population. An incredibly important window into the University’s history of civil rights dialogues, which continue to this day, “1968...” will function as an excellent interstitial piece for use on the channel.

Airing of the documentary will be immediately following “Portraits...” and interspersed randomly throughout the month.

“The Jackie Robinson Story”.

This special documentary is built around the original movie from 1950 starring Mr. Robinson himself, and also includes historical footage from Mr. Robinson’s life including his appearance before congress. President Ronald Regan is heard eulogizing Jackie at his death.

Airing the 1st, 10th, 19th, 26th and the 29th at 8:30 pm.

“A voice from The Movement”.

Dr. Cleveland Sellers Jr. speaks on his history with the Civil Rights Movement. Dr. Sellers was the featured speaker for Black History Month 2014. This is a program we produced from his lecture recorded in the Honors College in partnership with MTSU Black History Month and Dr. Sekou Franklin.

The talk will air the 1st, 15th and 24th at 2:00 pm, Saturday the 6th at 3:30, as well as the 2nd, 11th and 25th at 8:30 pm.

“Memories and Music on the McDonald Craig Farm”.

One of the “Land and the Legacy: The Stories of Tennessee’s Century Farms” series we produced for Ms. Caneta S. Hankins and the Center for Historic Preservation, “Memories and Music...” celebrates the longest continuously operating African American family farm in Tennessee, having been purchased right after emancipation and one of the few farms in Tennessee purchased by former slaves. The patriarch, McDonald Craig, tells us the family story and, being a talented performer, serenades us with choice selections from his body of work. His song “My Home in Tennessee” was used as the series opening music.

Program airs the 2nd, 11th, 20th, 25th and 28th at 7:30 pm. It will also air the 23rd at 8:30 pm.

“Strong Inside: Perry Wallace and the Collision of Race and Sports in the South”.

An ERC “MT Presents” program featuring author Andrew Maraniss discussing his New York Times Best Selling biography of Washington University law professor Perry Wallace, who in 1966 enrolled at Vanderbilt University and became the first African-American basketball player in the Southeastern Conference.

Presented by ERC with the College of Liberal Arts.

Airs the 4th, 9th, 18th and the 22nd at 8:30 pm.

“The Drexel Interview”. Produced at Drexel University, this weekly interview program this month features a two part exploration of the National Civil Rights Museum in Memphis Tennessee. Host Paula Marantz Cohen and various members of the museum’s staff discuss the history of the movement and visit corresponding exhibits of interest to students and educators.

“Drexel” airs on Wednesday at 8:30 am and 1:30 pm. Parts one and two will air on alternating Wednesdays.

“Living Longer, Living Better”. This month’s episode of the series features an interview with two of the original Tuskegee Airmen, Lieutenant LeRoy Gillead and Captain Les Williams, on their work during World War II and the Civil Rights Movement.

LL, LB airs Wednesday at 7:30am and Sundays at 8:00 am.

“Along the Blackstone”. The episode this month features the history of the Underground Railroad along the Blackstone River with National Park Service Rangers re-enacting the slaves’ journey along the river to freedom. Produced by the Blackstone River Valley National Heritage Corridor.

Airing Mondays and Fridays at 11:00 pm and Tuesday at 7:30 pm.

New programming:

Although not about Black History Month per se, we are also introducing a new series for ERC@MT, a new show, and a new episode of an existing series on the channel.

“MT Conversations”. Continuing in the vein of “MT Centennial Conversations”, the all new series “MT Conversations” will feature in-depth interviews with faculty and academic experts on their research, projects and outreach to the broader community. This first episode features Dr. Daniel Erenzo and his ground breaking work with undergraduates using laser tweezers to research sickle cell structure.

The show airs on Sundays at 12:00 pm and 6:00 pm.

“Africa Rising: Expanding Markets, Expanding Opportunities”. Consultant Karol C. Boudreaux discusses the rise of markets and changing economic trends on the continent and their effect on world markets. This is another in the “MT Presents” series by the ERC featuring guest speakers and events on campus of interest to the University and outside communities. Presented in conjunction with the Economics and Finance Department, the Honors College and the Economics Club.

Airs the 1st, 10th, 19th at 6:00 pm, and the 22nd and 29th at 2:00 pm.

“Nashville Zoo at Grassmere: Project Feeder Watch”. School Program Manager Thaisa Bell continued her excellent work with K-3 students in this first of a five episode series produced by AV Services, the ERC and the Center for Educational Media in partnership with the Nashville Zoo. Each educational lesson covers various fun subjects such as animals, science, nature or ecology, aimed at K-3 school and homeschool students.

- ❖ An event / activity sponsored by a not-for-profit organization that charges a fee to support a documented charitable organization (401C), public school activity, or public service organization.
- ❖ Non-event information must provide a public service to the community or provide information about MTSU departments / offices / organizations.

The following types of bulletin requests will not be accepted:

- ❖ Political announcements, endorsements, advertisements, meetings, etc.
- ❖ Announcements, endorsements, advertisements, meetings, etc. for / by religious organizations.
- ❖ Events / activities / advertising, etc. sponsored by for-profit organizations.

On April 11, 2016 at 12:00 noon in the Council Chambers of Murfreesboro City Hall the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission will make its annual evaluation of MTSU's use of both educational access channels located on Comcast cable channel 9 and 10 within Murfreesboro following a public hearing. The license of the second MTSU educational channel is subject to termination upon ninety (90) days notice following the public hearing.

MTSU's Channel 10 faculty advisor and/or representative is encouraged to provide a report (please include a programming schedule) and presentation regarding Cable Channel 10 as it relates to the criteria the Commission will use to evaluate the channel. If you would like to include a report for the Commission to review prior to the meeting to help the Commissioner's better prepare, please provide me with the report via .pdf to abozeman@murfreesborotn.gov no later than April 1, 2016.

During your presentation to the Commission, staff requests that you include or be prepared to address several questions related to programming on Channel 10:

- How many hours of new locally produced/non repeat educational programming on channel 10 were provided to Murfreesboro cable subscribers during 2015? What were some of these programs?

- When locally produced educational programming isn't being cablecast, what are some of the other types of programming sources available to Murfreesboro cable subscribers on Channel 10? What new, if any, satellite/non-locally produced programming are being planned for during 2016?
- How many months out of the year is channel 10 programming locally produced educational content?
- What new locally produced programs or initiatives took place with channel 10 during 2015 and are being planned for 2016 for the Murfreesboro cable subscribers benefit?
- From a technical standpoint, how is the channel monitored and what procedures are in place to respond to technical issues, such as the channel being off the air and in black or frozen for extended periods of time?

Mission Statement of the Educational Resource Channel @ Middle Tennessee

The Education Resource Channel @ Middle Tennessee is the name of Rutherford County's educational access cable Channel 9. The ERC @ MT's primary focus will be to produce unique programming to enhance K-12 education, teacher professional development, and lifelong community learning in middle Tennessee; to create and produce high quality video programs of educational merit; and to record outstanding academic events that enhance the University's mission to educate a diverse student body. The ERC @ MT also locates external sources of programming that supports the University's mission to promoting openness and service to the community. The channel strives to deliver all of its programming via technologically appropriate and cost effective venues.

Criteria 1 – Public Good

The channels will serve the citizens of Murfreesboro and the university community with educational, informational, and entertainment programming.

Programming sources may vary by availability and contractual considerations. The goal of the channels is to increase the programming choices available to the cable subscriber. The channels will include programming with wide appeal as well as programming for more narrowly defined college student audiences which may include, but are not limited to: telecourse programs, foreign language newscasts, university produced programs, and college student produced programs.

Program sources, choices, and scheduling are decisions made within the respective department and division of the university, reflecting the policies and procedures as well as the pedagogical philosophies of those units.

Criteria 2 – Signal Quality

The channels will maintain a signal quality comparable to other access channels on the Murfreesboro cable system.

Internal factor: The University invests in physical facilities to equip the channels origination points consistent with the Board of Regents policy.

External Factor: Through program suppliers, satellite delivery systems, connections with the cable system head-end, and other avenues, the channels will strive for the highest signal quality possible.

Criteria 3 – Other Relevant Factors

The channels will adhere to the mission statements of the University, the Center for Educational Media, and the College of Mass Communication with the Department of Electronic Media Communication as a subunit of the College.

WHEREAS, the franchise agreement with Robin Media Group Inc., dba Intermedia provides for two (2) PEG channels for MTSU, subject to rules and regulations approved by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission considers a PEG channel to be a valuable asset of the community that should be utilized for the public good and therefore is willing to only grant a second PEG channel to MTSU conditionally as set forth below herein.


ORDER

This matter came on for consideration on the 9th day of November 1998 before the Murfreesboro Cable Television Commission upon the request of MTSU for a second PEG channel. Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was

RESOLVED to grant MTSU a second PEG channel effective January 1, 1999, subject to evaluation of MTSU's use of both PEG channels for the public good, consideration of signal quality, and other relevant factors relating thereto. The CATV Commission will make its evaluation of MTSU's use of both channels in May 1999

following a public hearing and annually thereafter. The license of the second PEG channel is subject to termination upon ninety (90) days notice following any annual review following a public hearing. This Order 98-03 is subject to the approval of the Murfreesboro City Council; further review by the Cable Television Commission at its December 1998 meeting; and to acceptance of its terms by Middle Tennessee State University.



Hearing regarding Middle Tennessee Channel 10**

In 2015: MT10 News produced 1.5 hours of live content per week for 20 weeks, our sports talk show NSEN produced 1 hours worth of shows per week, and late night talk shows like Murfreesboro After Dark produced 8 hours of content.

Several new shows were created in the last six months, including a music show, In Tune, which features Nashville and Murfreesboro bred artists. The Raider Report was a high school sports show that contributed 6 hours of original high school sports coverage in 2015. In total, these shows have produced around 9 hours of content thus far, and are projected to produce 10 hours of content per semester in the future.

In addition to in-house shows, MT10 also produced live broadcasts such as the 2015 Murfreesboro Christmas Parade, and carried MTSU basketball, football, soccer, and volleyball games produced by classes and other student organizations, totaling approximately 50 hours. We also aired other class projects including the Tuesday/Thursday News 3 class newscasts and awards shows like the 2014 Blue Spark Awards, Raider's Choice Awards and original student produced movies/documentaries.

Overall the entirely volunteer, student-run station aired more than 110 hours of locally produced content in the year 2015.
