July 'Adventures in Murphry's Burrow' takes a trip to Batey Farms

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. – Take a trip to Rutherford County's oldest operational farm, the famous Batey Farm, in this month's episode of "Adventures in Murphry's Burrow." The monthly show on CityTV is one big educational adventure after another to learn about the City of Murfreesboro. So count on a whole lot of fun as you explore Batey Farm and pay a visit to the Murfreesboro Farmer's Market on the historic Rutherford County Courthouse Square.

This month's show features:

- Meet a 700 lb. hog named Wilbur, now 9 years old, who debuted on the cover of a version of the *Charlotte's Web* children's book by author, E.B. White.
- Murph talks to Batey Farms owner John L. Batey about life 'Down on the Farm,' including plow mules, hay, field corn, soybeans, wheat, milo and hogs.
- Murph's conversation with John Batey features a 3-week old baby pig about the same age as Wilber when he was photographed for the book cover.
- Visit the Murfreesboro Farmer's Market on the historic downtown Square where fruit and vegetables, meat and bread, are among home-grown foods sold every Saturday throughout the summer.
- Meet the Cripple Creek Cloggers who show off some of their fancy work.
- Read along with the featured book, Freddie's Garden, and make flowers out of tissue paper.
